We are thrilled to celebrate 24 years of grape picking with you! The vineyard is the greenest green and the grapes are gonna be sweet! And now... we are eager to get our pruners and buckets ready for another harvest. It is our favorite time of the year! The time when we are joined by the finest grape and wine enthusiasts around! YES... it is almost time to pick those grapes! Well, not now, but soon enough, we will wake up to ripe grapes ready to make wine! We are always thrilled to have you join us for our picking days! We have so many guests ask about grape picking and we are thrilled to add new folks to our picking crews. There is something very special about spending a harvest morning in the vineyard.

And I will guarantee that you will have a good

time and make lots of memories. I speak from

many years of picking experience. Sooooo

many good times. Soooooo many memories.

"Picking Sundays" are our chance to share all that glorious summer sunshine with you! It's our chance to share our favorite time of year... gathering in the vineyard for the grape harvest. Celebrate with Holy-Field as we bring in the 2018 Harvest. Harvest season is an opportunity to discover the agriculture behind the wine. Come pick grapes with us, taste the fruit right off the vine, then taste the juice as we press in the cellar. "Picking Sundays" are family friendly. We love seeing entire families and generations of families enjoy the vineyard. Every year we get to share the experience with so many great volunteers and every year the harvest is just as sweet because of your participation. We couldn't do it without your help. Our volunteer harvest crews are special and your help translates directly to making the wine just as special. Plan now for grape picking... find out first hand all about a good old-fashioned fun time!

What are "Picking Sundays?"

"Picking Sundays" are a traditional midwestern harvest where people, groups, "Picking Sundays" are a traditional midwestern harvest where people, groups, clubs and families from all over get together to enjoy the vineyard experience of bringing in the grape harvest. A fun morning of grape picking...and tasting the grapes!

Our estimated picking schedule will be (all dates are Sundays @ 8 a.m.): August 12, 19, 26, and September 2, 9, 16, 23, 30 and October 7.

All dates are dependent upon Mother Nature, so these dates are tentative. We may add an occasional Saturday. And some dates we may not pick at all. You know that Mother Nature isn't all that reliable. Each Sunday is spent harvesting and crushing different grapes. Join us for a rewarding "**Picking Sunday**" and meet

at the winery at 8:00 AM. Plan to stay after grape picking for an old-fashioned homemade farm lunch and visit the wine cellar to see the crush and taste the juice!!

Reservations are REQUIRED for "Picking Sundays." (Free reservation. Just need a number of volunteers to plan for lunch). Remember to call the Winery at 913-724-WINE (9463) and let us know if you'll be a part of the 2016 Harvest Crew. It is a fun experience for the whole family and we hope to share it with you!

*The picking dates are tentative and depending on the season, dates may be canceled, and some Saturday dates may be added. Sometimes we have more grapes ready to pick than a Sunday allows and we may add a couple of Saturday dates. Saturday grape pickers will be treated to a pizza party after picking. In the event of cancellation, you will be contacted by phone.

FORTIFIED WINE AND FOOD

As far as pairing fortified wines with food goes, Doug Frost offers this advice: "A dessert wine should be as sweet or sweeter than the dessert. In general, sweet wine is a fantastic foil for cheese; cheese really isn't as good a foil for red wine as mythology tells us." Frost recommends serving fortified wines in a smaller wine glass that has a bowl tapering inward, "so you can catch all the good smells waiting for you."

Kansas City-based American Master of Wine and Master Sommelier Doug Frost has been working in the regional wine industry for almost 40 years, and he's a regular judge at the Missouri Wine Competition. He recommends the following local fortified wine to try right now, including tasting notes for each.

"First and foremost, [when judging wine, you're] trying to find a good representation of the style. Secondarily, [you're] looking for balance — [that] the sugar doesn't stick out to the degree that the wine is cloying," Frost says. "Grapes grown in this [region have a] high malic content; those characteristics lend themselves well to good, solid dessert-style fortified wines."

International East meets West article has More accolades for Amitié: 96 Points!

"Then came nine dry whites, including an Albarino from Braganini Reserve, a label of St. Julian (Paw Paw, Mich.; 95 pts), a white Bordeaux blend of Sauvignon Gris from Le Coin Chateau (Bordeaux, France; 98 pts), a Traminette from Holy-Field Vineyards & Winery (Basehor, Kan.; 96 pts), a semi-dry Riesling from 21 Brix Winery(Portland, N.Y.; 95 pts), a Vidal Blanc from Blumenhof Winery (Dutzow, Mich.; 92 pts), a Symphony from Arrington Vineyards (Arrington, Tenn.; 95 pts), a late harvest Riesling from Blustone Vineyards (Lake Leelanau, Mich.; 92 pts), a Muscat Canelli from Enoch's Stomp Vineyard & Winery (Harleton, Texas; 92 pts) and a Niagara from Johnson Estate (92 pts).

On the first round of voting, the Kansas Traminette scored a whopping 15 votes—the most cast for a wine in the entire sweeps. It dominated over the second place Niagara in a second ballot, scoring 15 votes to the Niagara's seven.

In voting that came down to a face-off between the Traminette and the Catawba, the former triumphed 13-8. Go, Kansas!

The Thrilling Finale: Then it was time for the East Meets West shootout for overall Best of Show honors. In close voting, the Traminette from the East won, 12 to 10. To Kansas went the crown.

I'd highly recommend obtaining a case of the Best of Show wine, with its Gewürztraminer-like aromatics and flavor profile, it's a delight to drink. Isn't that what it's all about?"
